Principal Moderator's Report

There were a total of eight centres entered for the March series, 2018.

All centres submitted portfolios of work which were well presented and well organised and this was very helpful during the moderation process. Centres should ensure that the correct candidate number is inserted on the Candidate Record Sheet and that there is one of these for each candidate and for each individual unit.

In general the work was well annotated by the teacher to show clearly where the assessment criteria had been met. Again this is very helpful during moderation.

Centres are reminded that all assessment criteria must be met in order to achieve the specific level whether at Entry 1, 2 or 3. If candidates are unable to meet the assessment criteria, for example at Entry Level 3, it may be more appropriate to complete tasks aimed at Entry Level 2.

Overall there was a range of interesting work, particularly for Unit 4: N.I. A Practical Investigation of Local History. Teachers and candidates are to be commended for the enthusiasm and diligence demonstrated in many of the portfolios viewed at moderation.
