This component will be available for candidates wishing to be assessed in all components. A new stimulus paper will be released in January 2022.

For those students who started their GCSE course in September 2020 and are due to enter the GCSE in Summer 2022, should they choose to sit all components of the GCSE, they will receive the higher of either:

- the grade awarded on the basis of the outcome of the required component specified by CCEA; or
- the grade awarded on the basis of the outcome of the full set of components for that qualification.

In both cases the full specification content should still be delivered.

For candidates commencing their GCSE course in September 2021 and due to enter in Summer 2023, it is recommended that, as far as possible, the components are delivered in numerical order in case of any further disruption to the academic year.
