Unit 1: Motor Vehicle and Road User Theory	External written examination 1 hour 45 mins Students answer questions on the following areas: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Vehicle Control and Road User Behaviour; • Legal Requirements; • Road Transport and Its Effects on Society; • Motoring Mathematics; • Collision Procedures; and • Motor Vehicle Technology. 	50%	No changes.
Unit 2: Investigative Study	Controlled assessment Students collect data on a moving traffic situation. They may do this in groups. Students write the investigative study. They must do this individually. Teachers mark the task, and we moderate the results.	25%	Students are permitted to use archive data instead of collecting their own data.

Content	Assessment	Weightings	Assessment Adaptations 2021–2022
Unit 3: Practical Riding Activity	Controlled assessment Students carry out a moped riding activity to demonstrate skills of vehicle control and roadcraft. Teachers mark the task, and we moderate the results.	25%	This unit will be eligible for omission for candidates cashing in for the qualification level grade in Summer 2022. This unit will still be available for any candidates wishing to be assessed in all units. For those who choose to complete Unit 3, visiting Moderation will be in place for Summer 2022; however, CCEA will keep this under review in light of the changing public health context.

For those students who started their GCSE course in September 2020 and are due to cash in the full GCSE in Summer 2022, should they choose to sit all units of the GCSE, they will receive the higher of either:

- the grade awarded on the basis of the outcome of the required units specified by CCEA; or
- the grade awarded on the basis of the outcome of the full set of units for that qualification.

In both cases the full specification content should still be delivered.

For candidates commencing their GCSE course in September 2021, it is recommended that, as far as possible, the units are delivered in numerical order in case of any further disruption to the academic year.
