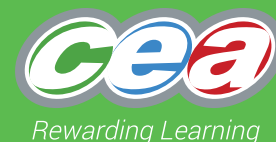

Centre Determined Grades submitted on time to CCEA by schools and colleges.



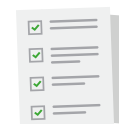
283 Centre Determined Grade (CDG) policies completed on time, reviewed and accepted by CCEA.



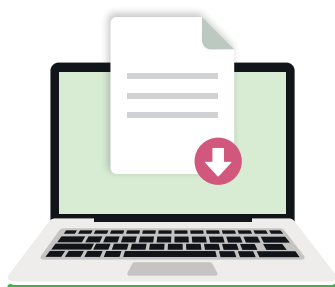
480 school leaders trained by the Chartered Institute of Educational Assessors
